## Convocation Trust Bursary

### 2019/20

#### What is the Convocation bursary and award?

The Bursary is made available to cover tuition fees up to a maximum of £7,500 and will be awarded to students who have demonstrably excelled in their undergraduate degree.

#### Eligibility

The primary criterion on which applications are judged is academic merit. The successful applicant will be of exceptional quality, evidenced by previous academic achievement at undergraduate level, with an outstanding mark achieved in the final-year project/dissertation. Successful applicants will have a genuine and demonstrable interest in undertaking a master's degree at the School of Advanced Study. In addition, awards are open to students who are:

- self-funded and domiciled in the UK, European Union (EU) or overseas;
- studying full-time or part-time for a maximum of one year;
- undertaking a SAS Masters programme in any subject (excluding Distance Learning, PGDip and PGCert)

#### How to apply? Applicants must have:

- submitted a complete application to undertake a postgraduate taught programme at the School;
- completed this form and submitted any supporting evidence either in hard copy (SAS Registry, Ground Floor, Senate House, Malet Street, London, WC1E 7HU) or via email to SAS Registry (Studentships@sas.ac.uk)

#### Deadline?

- 1 May 2019

#### Decision and how this is communicated?

- Competitive process
- Panel of senior staff
- Decision is final and will be communicated to applicants via email by mid-July
- Applications will be considered alongside the application for postgraduate study
