### **Call for Expressions of Interest 2017 Entry**

Expressions of interest should be submitted by Friday 6 January 2017 in the form of a Word document comprising:

- Two-page curriculum vitae;
- Two-page project description (including objectives, methodology and outcomes);
- Brief (one-page) statement outlining how the project fits within the research profile of SAS and one or more of its constituent institutes;
- One academic reference in support of application, which must be submitted direct via email by the same closing date – Friday 6 January 2017;
- and names of two further referees.

Candidates will be informed whether or not the School will support their applications by Friday 3 February 2017.

The School will provide those candidates it has decided to support with assistance in refining their full applications to the Leverhulme Trust. These must be submitted to the Leverhulme Trust by the deadline of 4.00 pm, Thursday 2 March 2017.
